Analysis:

• In Carmarthenshire unemployment has dropped by 1.6 percentage points, this decline in unemployment can be seen across Wales and England as well. Suggesting Carmarthenshire is in line with employment trends nationally.

- 43,170 (27.8%) people in the county have retired, an increase of 9.7 percentage points, a higher percentage point increase than in Wales (8.6) and England and Wales (7.8). The proportion of retired residents (27.8%) is now almost as high as the proportion in full-time employment 30%, this is not the case in Wales, or England and Wales, despite a substantial increase in the number retired.
- Carmarthenshire exhibits a higher-than-average level of those who are long-term sick or disabled. The county also has higher than average levels of selfemployment.

- People aged 16 years and over are economically active if, between 15 March and 21 March 2021, they were: \* in employment (an employee or selfemployed) \* unemployed, but looking for work and could start within two weeks \* unemployed, but waiting to start a job that had been offered and accepted
- It is a measure of whether or not a person was an active participant in the labour market during this period. Economically inactive are those aged 16 years and over who did not have a job between 15 March to 21 March 2021 and had not looked for work between 22 February to 21 March 2021 or could not start work within two weeks.
