Analysis:

- The proportion of people working full-time in Carmarthenshire has dropped slightly to 69.8% compared to 70.1% previously, while Wales, and England and Wales have remained constant.
- Full-time workers are now working less hours in Carmarthenshire, Wales and in England and Wales. However, a greater proportion of people in Carmarthenshire are working over 49 hours when compared with national figures.
- A slightly higher proportion of people in Carmarthenshire are working part-time when compared with national figures.

Definition:

• The number of hours worked per week before the census includes paid and unpaid overtime. This covers the main job of anyone aged 16 years and over.
