About the role

Carmarthenshire SACRVE advises the Local Authority on Religion, Values and Ethics (RVE) and collective worship, supporting high-quality provision for all learners. Members play a key role in contributing to this work through discussion, representation and partnership.

Essential criteria

- Interest in education, RVE or collective worship.
- Commitment to inclusive, respectful engagement with a range of religious and non-religious worldviews.
- Willingness to support high-quality RVE for all learners within Carmarthenshire schools
- Awareness of (or willingness to develop understanding of) RVE within the Curriculum for Wales and diverse beliefs and worldviews.
- Understanding of the importance of diversity, equity and community cohesion.
- Ability to contribute constructively to discussion and decision-making.
- Willingness to represent a group or perspective where appropriate.
- Ability to listen, reflect and engage respectfully with different viewpoints.
- Attend termly meetings and prepare by reading papers.

Desirable criteria

- Experience in education, community, faith or belief representation, or governance.
- Experience of working in a committee or advisory role.
- Interest in contributing to wider SACRVE work (e.g. guidance, working groups, events).

Key responsibilities

- Advise Carmarthenshire Local Authority on RVE and collective worship.
- Support monitoring and development of provision in Carmarthenshire schools.
- Promote inclusive and balanced representation of beliefs and values.
- Act as an ambassador for SACRVE within your community or professional network
