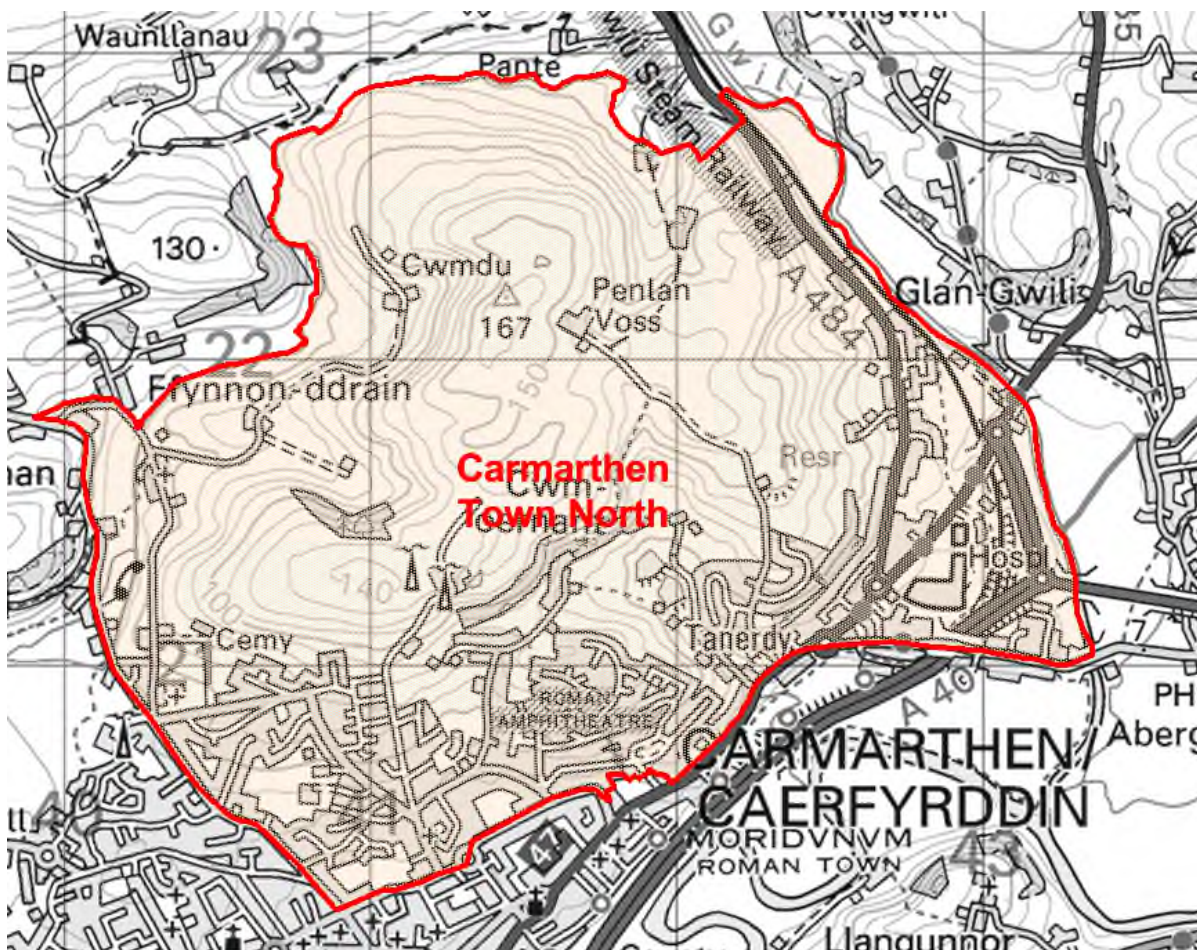

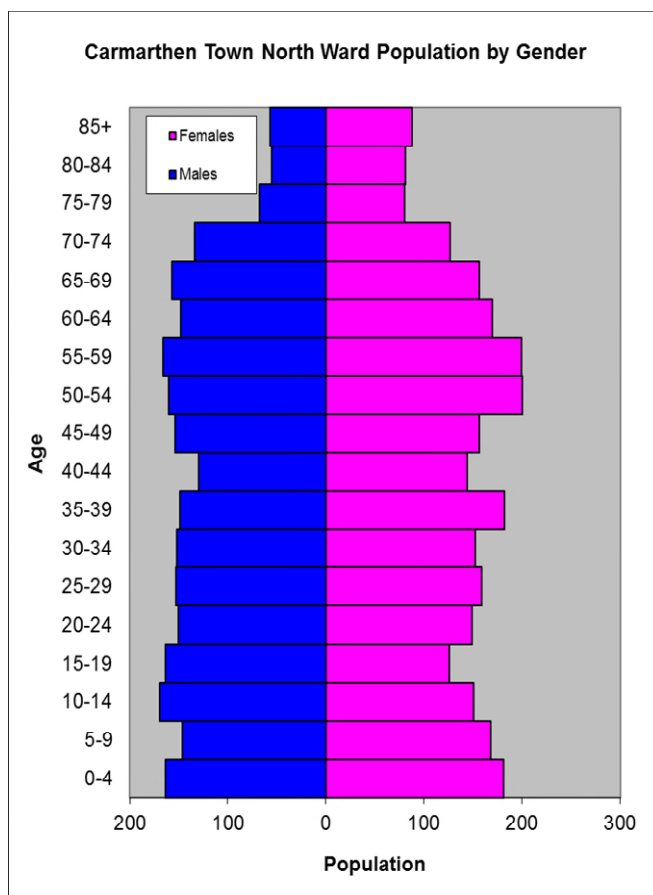

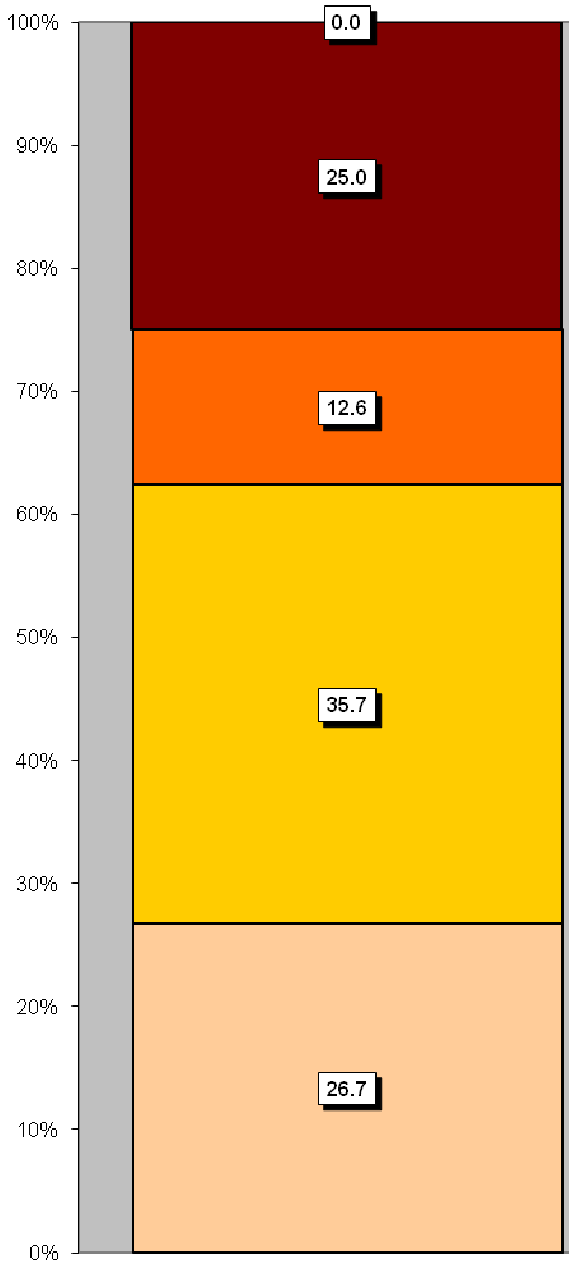

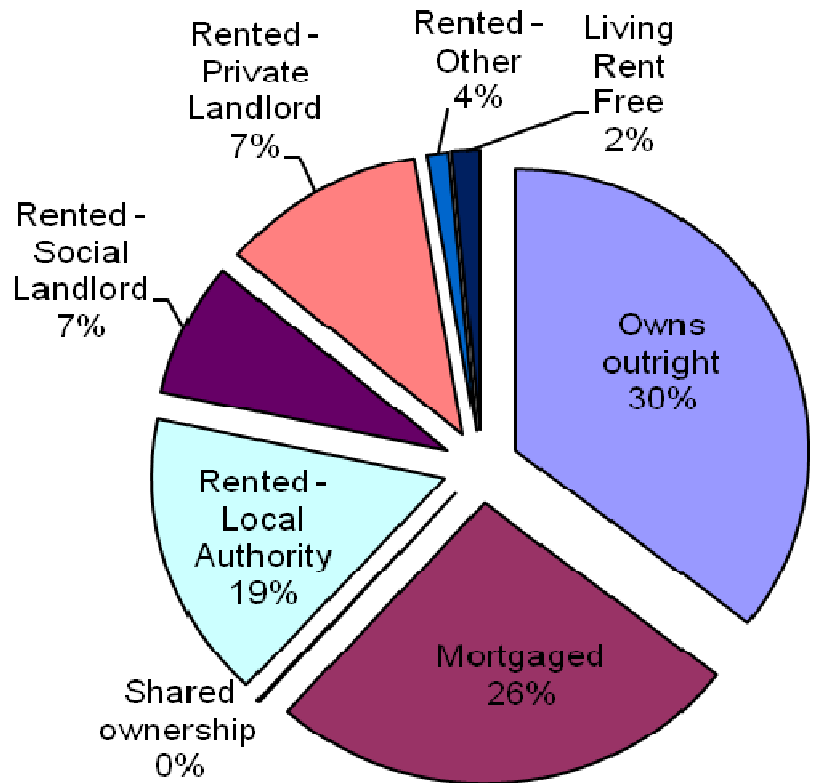
HOUSING

There is a very small proportion of caravan or other mobile temporary structure. The ward consists of 375 local authority owned properties and 175 Housing Association properties.

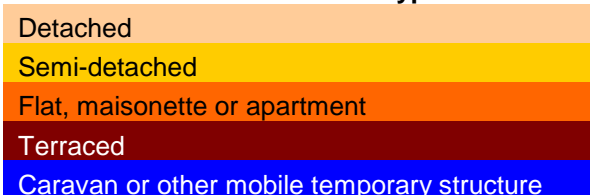

SOCIO-ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

- ⇒ The estimated median household income for Carmarthen Town North, based on CACI's 2017 'PayCheck' data, is £24,632 which is the 20th lowest (of 58 wards) in Carmarthenshire and 3% below the Carmarthenshire median of £25,365.
- ⇒ The social profile information indicates a higher than average level of people with higher and lower managerial and professional administrative occupations (Levels 1-2).

WELSH INDEX OF MULTIPLE DEPRIVATION (WIMD)

WIMD 2014 based on fine-grained geography of lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs). The WIMD 2014 is compiled from eight domains, Income, Employment, Health, Education, Housing, Access to Services, Physical Environment and Community Safety and is published at Lower Super Output Area of which there are 112 in Carmarthenshire.

Under WIMD, where Rank 1 is the most deprived, **Carmarthen Town North 1** ranks 29 out of the 112 LSOAs in Carmarthenshire and ranks 644 in Wales from 1909 LSOAs. **Carmarthen Town North 2** ranks 7 in Carmarthenshire and 266 in Wales, **Carmarthen Town North 3** ranks 72 in Carmarthenshire and 1080 in Wales whilst **Carmarthen Town North 4** ranks 111 from 112 in Carmarthenshire which makes it one of the least deprived areas in the county and 1761 from 1909 in Wales.

The highest level of deprivation attributed to **Carmarthen Town North 1** is the Education domain, being ranked 13th in Carmarthenshire and 400 in Wales for this domain, **Carmarthen Town North 2** has the Income domain showing the highest deprivation ranking 3rd in Carmarthenshire and 156 in Wales. In **Carmarthen Town North 3** however the highest level of deprivation is attributed to the Community Safety domain ranking 16th in Carmarthenshire and 546 in Wales. A similar picture is painted in **Carmarthen Town North 4**, which has the Community Safety domain as the highest level of deprivation being ranked 48th in Carmarthenshire and 1204 in Wales.
