	A road safety and footway prioritisation database is held and maintained by the council. This is populated by requests from local residents and local members. Requests are scored based on

criteria such as accident data,

traffic/pedestrian flow and volume of traffic with the top 20 ranking requests looked at in further detail before potentially being constructed based on funding.
