The Swansea Bay Regional Engagement Team (SBRET) is one of four teams set up in Wales to help ensure EU funding proposals meet existing and future opportunities and investments at regional levels.

The SBRET work across the counties of Carmarthenshire, Neath Port Talbot, Pembrokeshire and Swansea, and across all sectors in the region to ensure the effective participation and success of EU funded investments. SBRET supports the region in the delivery of its **economic regeneration strategy** to improve the prospects of our communities, businesses and economy.

If you are considering applying for EU funding, contact us for guidance on how your project can support regional priorities, to make links to other projects and benefit from case studies and examples of best practice.

If you are already delivering an EU funded project, we would be keen to hear about how your projects is progressing. We could also look to feature some of your good news stories in the next newsletter.

Applications for EU funds are still being developed and approved in line with objectives agreed by the European Commission. [The UK Treasury](#) will provide a full lifetime guarantee for projects approved before the end of December 2020.

The guarantee also includes investments to UK organisations through the European Territorial Co-operation programmes from which Wales benefits, including the Ireland Wales programme, and programmes directly managed by the European Commission, such as Horizon 2020.



Swansea Bay City Deal

A £1.3bn investment programme in 11 major projects across the Swansea Bay City Region has taken a major step forward.

Carmarthenshire Council, Neath Port Talbot Council, Pembrokeshire Council, Swansea Council, the UK Government and the Welsh Government have now approved the Swansea Bay City Deal's Joint Committee Agreement (JCA).

The approval of the JCA, which outlines principles of City Deal working, means the City Deal's governance structure can be formally established. This will include a Joint Committee overseeing all aspects of the City Deal, as well as an Economic Strategy Board with representation from the private sector. The Joint Committee will meet for the first time in late August, with Ed Tomp, the Vice-President and General Manager of Valero UK, having already been selected as the Economic Strategy Board's preferred chairman.

The Swansea Bay City Deal is being funded, subject to the approval of businesses cases, by the UK Government, the Welsh Government, the public sector and the private sector. It's being led by the four regional local authorities, together with the Abertawe Bro Morgannwg and Hywel Dda University Health Boards, Swansea University, the University of Wales Trinity Saint David, and private sector partners.

Cllr Rob Stewart, Swansea Council Leader and Lead Leader for the Swansea Bay City Deal, said: "This is a landmark moment because it means we're now in a position to start delivering the Swansea Bay City Deal for the benefit of residents throughout the Swansea Bay City Region.

"The JCA is a vital foundation that has to be in place for the Swansea Bay City Deal to move forward, so its approval by all partners augurs well for a very exciting future. A formal governance structure for the City Deal will shortly be introduced for the very first time, which will lead, subject to the approval of businesses cases, to the securing of funding for all 11 transformational projects.

"Over the next 15 years, these projects will combine to give the City Region a £1.8bn boost, helping close the economic gap between South West Wales and far more affluent parts of the UK. The City Deal will also create close to 10,000 new, well-paid jobs in key sectors like life sciences, smart manufacturing, energy and the creative industries."

From September, the City Deal will feature as part of the enterprise and employability module of the Welsh Baccalaureate at schools across the county.

Following a trial in Carmarthenshire, the scheme could also be rolled out to schools in Swansea, Neath Port Talbot and Pembrokeshire in future.

A qualification for 14 to 19-year-olds in Wales, the Welsh Baccalaureate aims to help students develop knowledge and skills that universities and employers want them to have when they leave school.

The Carmarthenshire trial is part of the Skills and Talent initiative, being led by the Regional Learning and Skills Partnership South West and Mid Wales.

The Achieve through Work Experience Programme creates tailored work experience opportunities for young students

Are you interested in helping students to develop skills for the workplace?

Would you like the opportunity to talent spot and benefit from new ideas?

We are looking for employers who can host tailored, flexible work experience for students, which includes:

Work shadowing - Up to three days of unpaid work experience where the student observes someone in their role to understand how they do their job.

Work taster - Up to four weeks of unpaid work experience where the student has the opportunity to learn about work and the working environment by observing and undertaking some tasks.

Work placement - Four to six weeks of paid work experience where the student gets hands-on experience or works on a project.

You would be helping young students on higher education courses in Wales who face barriers in accessing work experience to develop and refine their employability skills through their work experience with you. These skills will help them become more employable.



GO Wales: Achieve through Work Experience is part-financed by the European Social Fund (ESF) through the Welsh Government and operates pan-Wales. It is designed to support the employability of young students on higher education courses in Wales and is aimed at young students who have faced barriers in accessing higher education or work experience and are most at risk of not securing employment, education or training when leaving their higher education course.

European Regional Development Fund (ERDF)



The BEACON Biorefining Centre of Excellence is a partnership between Aberystwyth, Bangor and Swansea Universities, working in the field of conversion of biomass into biobased products. Led by Aberystwyth University, the current operation is backed with nearly £8 million from the European Regional Development Fund through the Welsh Government.

BEACON helps Welsh businesses develop new ways of converting feedstocks (e.g. rye grass, oats, miscanthus) and waste streams into products which have applications in the pharmaceutical, chemicals, fuel and cosmetic industries.

BEACON offers businesses with interests in the biorefining sector access to the research, expertise and knowledge base of universities in Wales.

This encompasses a huge range of businesses in areas as diverse as: agrochemicals, biofuels, coatings and adhesives, cosmetics and personal care, essential oils, lubricants, nutraceuticals, pharmaceuticals, speciality polymers, surfactants, water and effluent treatment, for example.

The BEACON partners can help with:

Formulation of new biocomposites

Extrusion / bioplastics

Novel chemistries / applications

Metabolic engineering of yeasts

Protein modelling such as new enzymes, e.g. for food industry or bioprocessing

Here's how a local company collaborated with the BEACON operation:

NappiCycle, is a trading division of Natural UK, the largest washroom services and clinical waste collection company in Wales, dealing in hygiene and sanitary waste (e.g. nappies and incontinence pads from nursing and residential homes). BEACON initially contacted the Ammanford based company to learn more about their unique and innovative process and discuss potential opportunities for new markets and applications for the company's cellulose fibre waste stream.
