## Welsh Government Education Update Covid-19

## Changes to the admission appeals regulations during the coronavirus outbreak

On the 4<sup>th</sup> May 2020, Welsh Government (WG) released temporary changes to School Admissions Appeals. The document entitled "Education update Covid-19" can be found here.

The new temporary regulations will remain in force until 31st January 2021.

The temporary regulations will apply to:

- Appeals lodged between 4<sup>th</sup> May 2020 and 31<sup>st</sup> January 2021
- Appeals that have already been lodged before 4<sup>th</sup> May 2020 but have not yet been decided

## The key changes are:

- 1. All applications refused after the 28<sup>th</sup> February 2020 need a minimum of 28 calendar days to lodge an appeal.
- 2. Any application refused with less than 28 calendar days to lodge an appeal; parents will be emailed with a new deadline (giving 28 calendar days) to lodge an appeal.
- 3. There is no requirement to re-submit an appeal if already done so.
- 4. Face-to face appeal hearings have been replaced by telephone or video conferencing. Where telephone or video conferencing is not possible a decision will be determined using your written submission only.

## What does it mean for you as a parent:

- 5. You will be given a minimum of 28 calendar days to appeal against refusal of a school place.
- 6. You do not need to re-submit your appeal.
- 7. If you have been refused a place at a school, you **still have the right to appeal** against the decision.
- 8. You will still have the right to discuss and put your case forward **in person** to an independent Admissions Appeal Panel
- 9. You will not be asked to have a face to face meeting
- 10. You will have the choice to meet via the telephone or video conferencing or just through a written statement.
