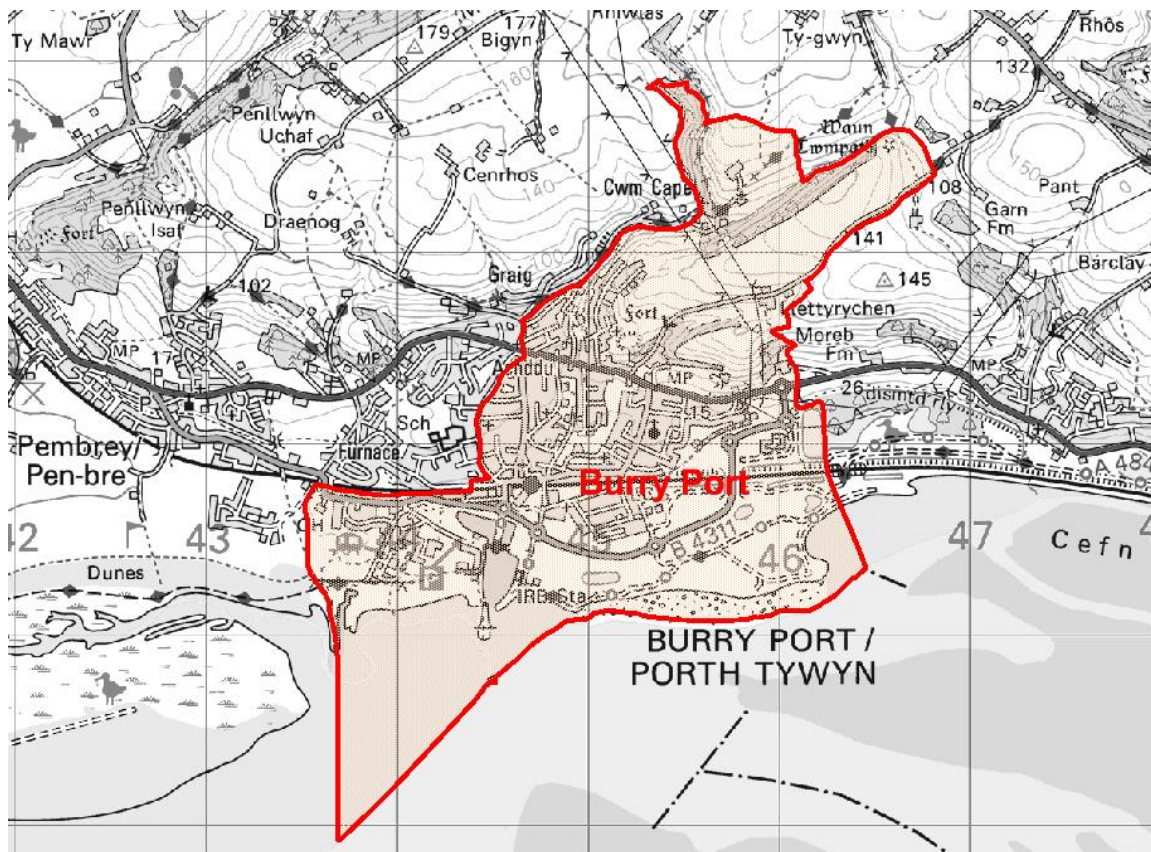

Location: Approximately 7.4 km from Llanelli Town and 24.3 km from Carmarthen Town

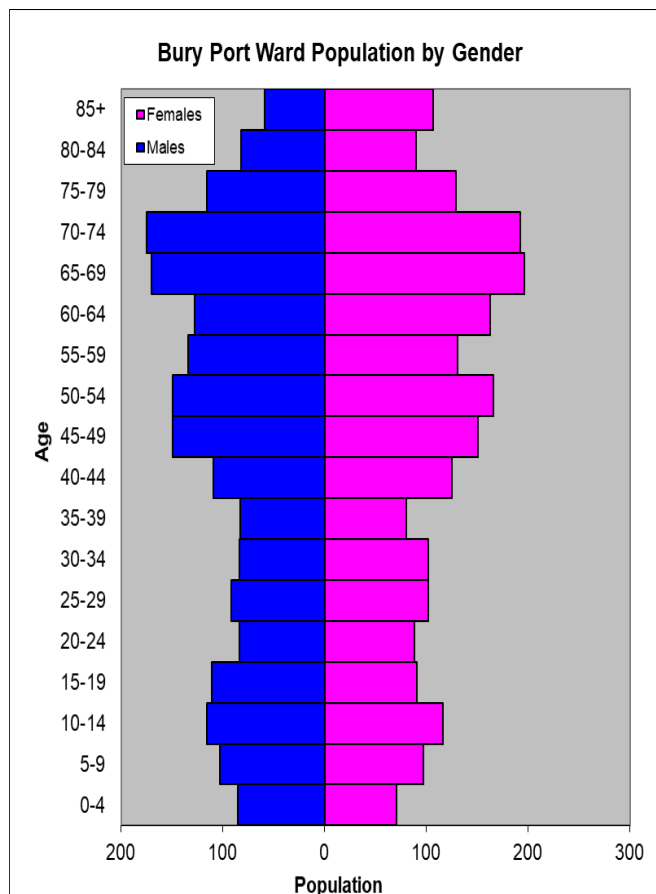

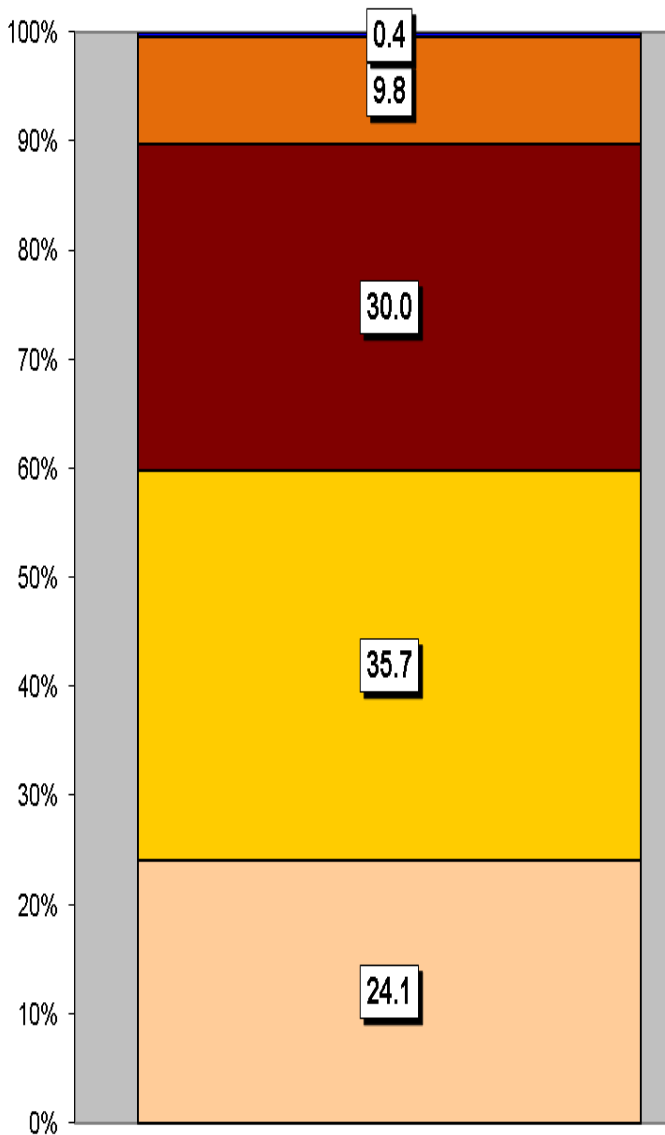

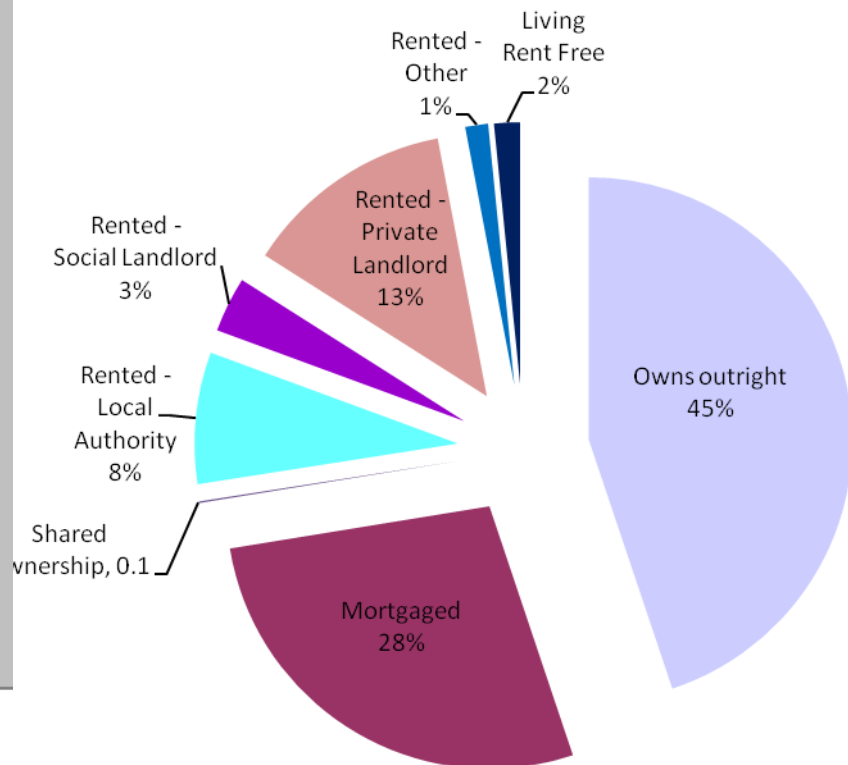
HOUSING

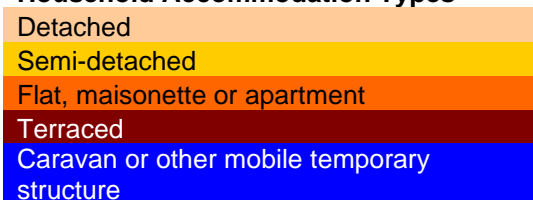

SOCIO-ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

- ⇒ The estimated median household income for Burry Port, based on CACI's 2019 'PayCheck' data, is £24,167 which is the 8th lowest (of 58 wards) in Carmarthenshire and 12.3% below the Carmarthenshire median of £27,148.
- ⇒ The social profile information indicates a higher than average level of people in semi-routine occupations (Level 6) and a slightly higher than average number of people who have never worked or are long term unemployed (Level 8).

WELSH INDEX OF MULTIPLE DEPRIVATION (WIMD)

WIMD 2019 based on fine-grained geography of lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs). The WIMD 2019 is compiled from eight domains, Income, Employment, Health, Education, Housing, Access to Services, Physical Environment and Community Safety and is published at Lower Super Output Area of which there are 112 in Carmarthenshire.

Under WIMD, where Rank 1 is the most deprived, **Burry Port 1** ranks 55 out of the 112 LSOAs in Carmarthenshire and ranks 896 in Wales from 1909 LSOAs, whilst **Burry Port 2** ranks 19th in Carmarthenshire and 443 in Wales. **Burry Port 3** ranks 86 in Carmarthenshire and 1220 in Wales.

The highest level of deprivation attributed to **Burry Port 1** is the Community Safety domain, being ranked 28th in Carmarthenshire and 739 in Wales. In **Burry Port 2** the Employment domain is the most prominent ranking 13th in Carmarthenshire and 297 in Wales. The Income and Employment domains rank as the highest level of deprivation in **Burry Port 3** ranking 51 in Carmarthenshire and 908 and 798 respectively in Wales.
