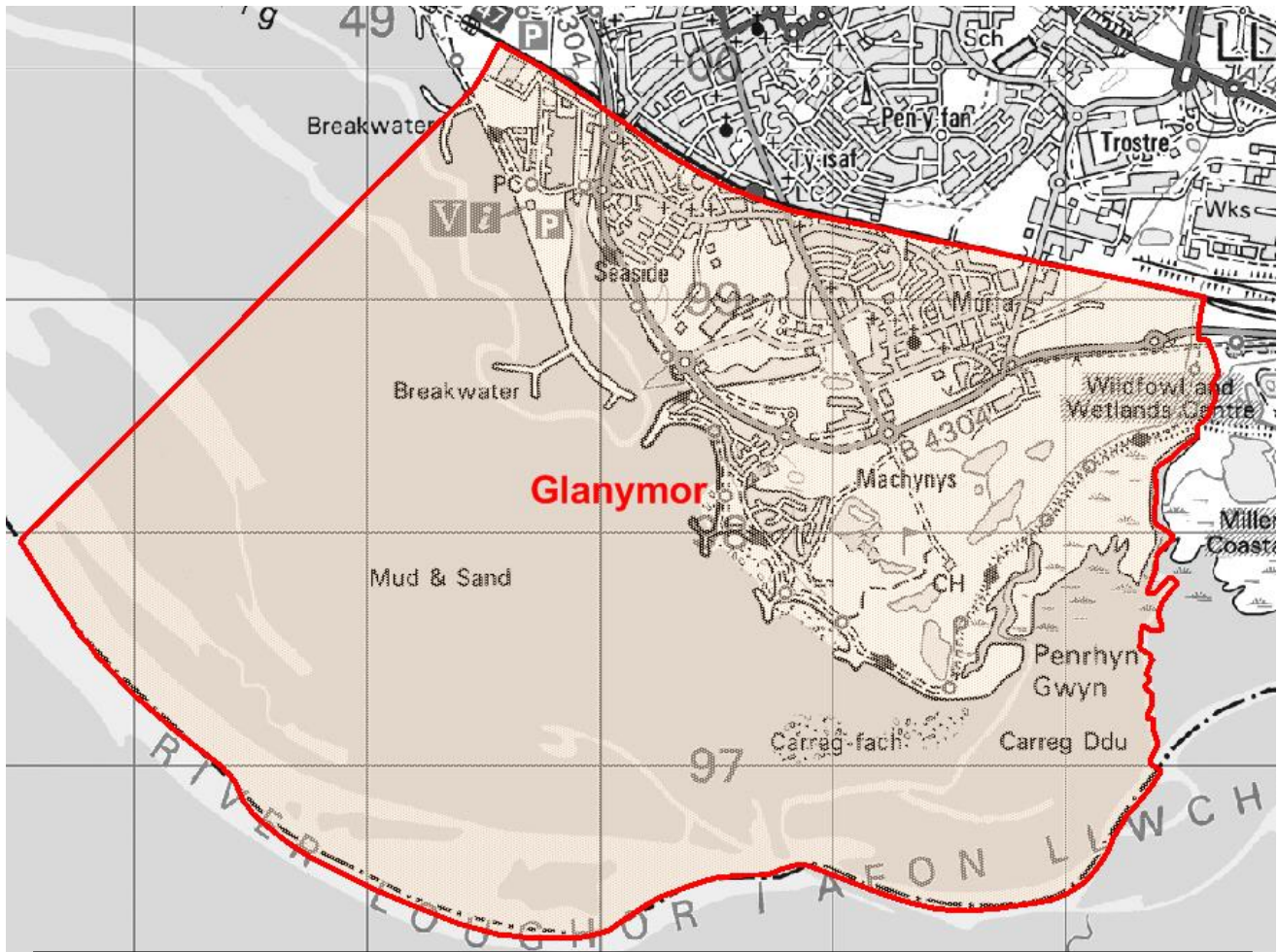

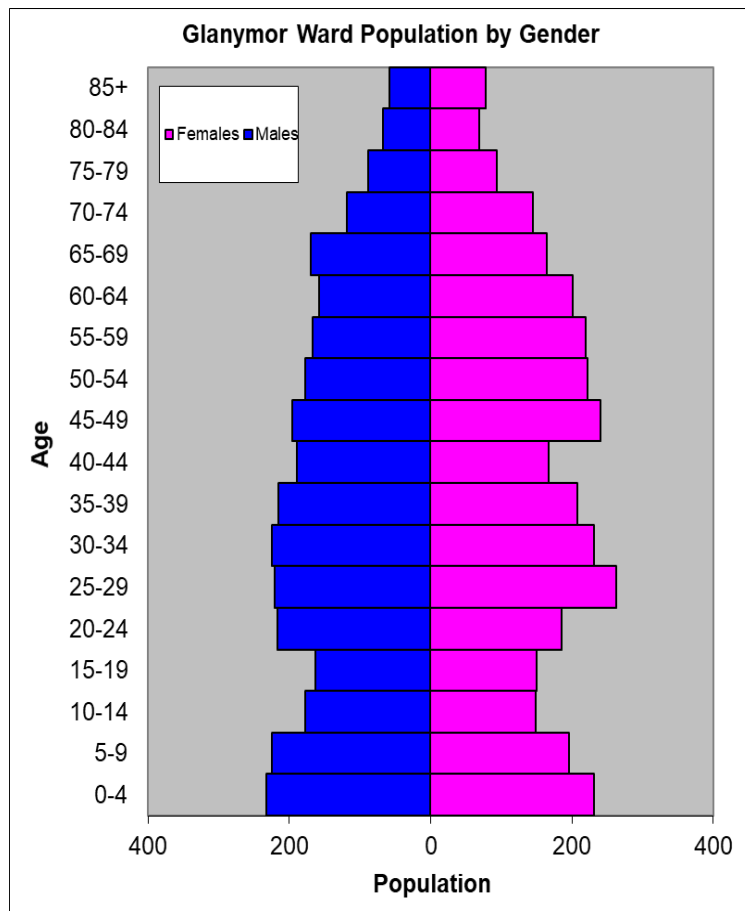

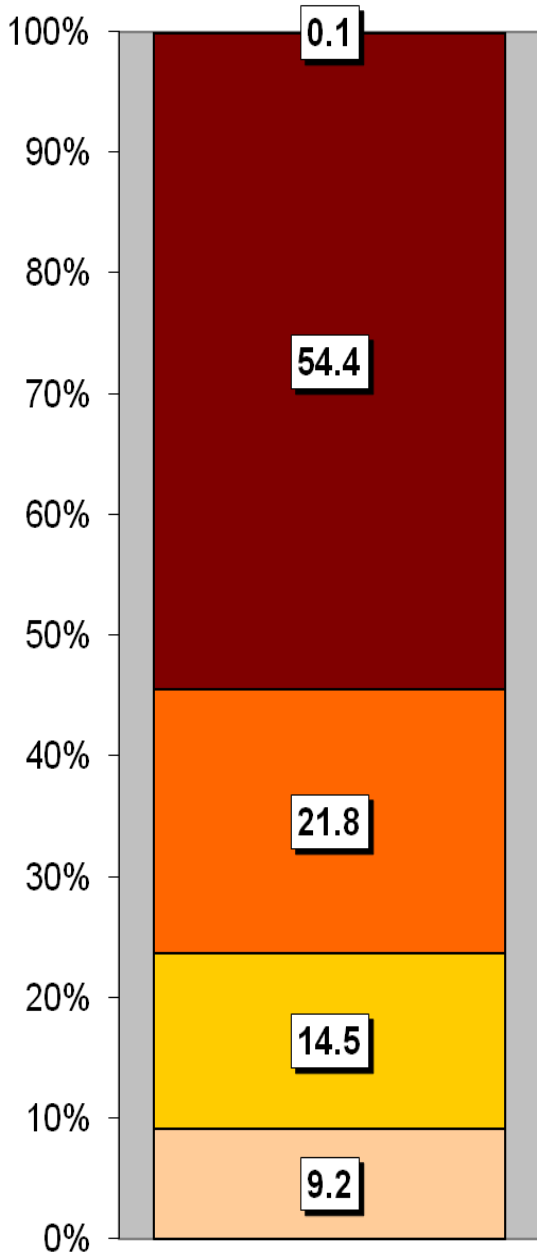

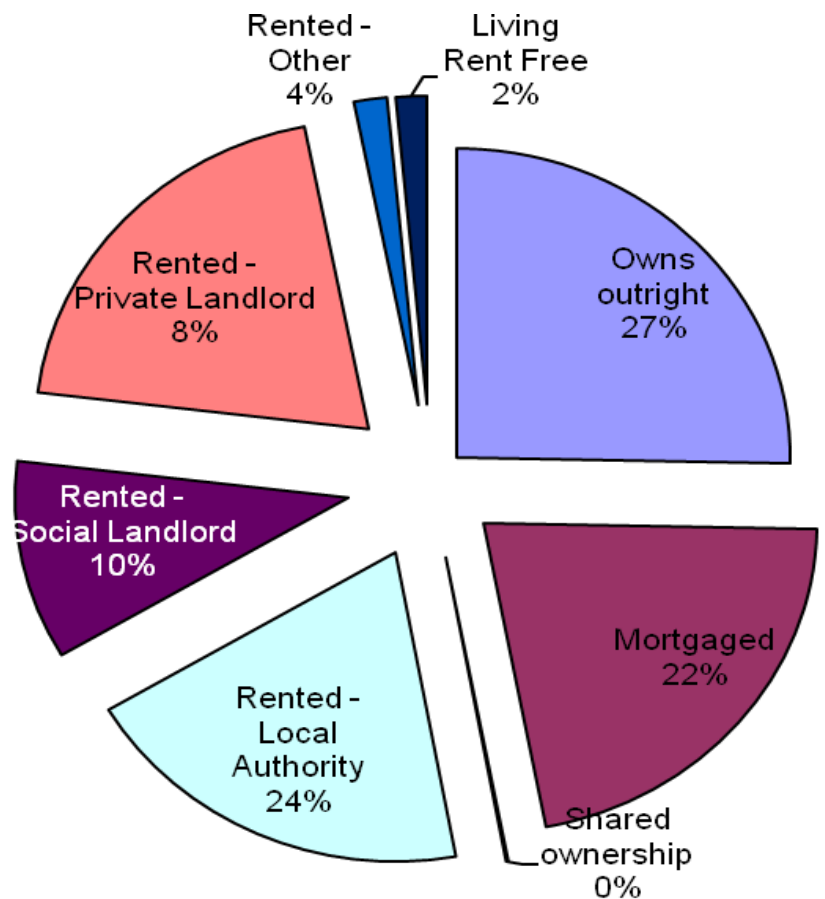
## HOUSING

## SOCIO-ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

- ⇒ The estimated median household income for Glanymor, based on CACI's 2019 'PayCheck' data, is £22,251 which is the 5<sup>th</sup> lowest (of 58 wards) in Carmarthenshire and 22% below the Carmarthenshire median of £27,148.
- ⇒ The social profile information indicates a higher than average level of people on in semi-routine and routine occupations (Levels 6-7) and a very high percentage of people who have never worked and been long term unemployed (Level 8).

## WELSH INDEX OF MULTIPLE DEPRIVATION (WIMD)

WIMD 2019 based on fine-grained geography of lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs). The WIMD 2019 is compiled from eight domains, Income, Employment, Health, Education, Housing, Access to Services, Physical Environment and Community Safety and is published at Lower Super Output Area of which there are 112 in Carmarthenshire.

Under WIMD, where Rank 1 is the most deprived **Glanymor 1** ranks 6 out of 112 LSOAs in Carmarthenshire and is ranked 196 in Wales from 1909 LSOAs. **Glanymor 2** ranks 8 in Carmarthenshire and 236 in Wales. **Glanymor 3** ranks 29 in Carmarthenshire out of 112 LSOAs and is ranked 553 in Wales. **Glanymor 4** ranks 2<sup>nd</sup> in Carmarthenshire out of 112 LSOAs and is ranked 68 out of 1909 LSOAs in Wales.

The highest level of deprivation attributed to **Glanymor 1** is the Education domain, being ranked 7<sup>th</sup> in Carmarthenshire and 135 in Wales. In **Glanymor 2** the Health domain is the most prominent ranking 5<sup>th</sup> in Carmarthenshire and 212 in Wales. In **Glanymor 3** the Physical Environment Domain is most prominent, ranked 10<sup>th</sup> in Carmarthenshire and 222 in Wales. Lastly, in **Glanymor 4**, the Employment domain is highest ranked, 2<sup>nd</sup> in Carmarthenshire and 92 out of 1909 LSOAs in Wales, Education 2<sup>nd</sup> in Carmarthenshire; (20 in Wales) and Income 3<sup>rd</sup> in Carmarthenshire (115 in Wales) are also domains of high deprivation for this LSOA.
