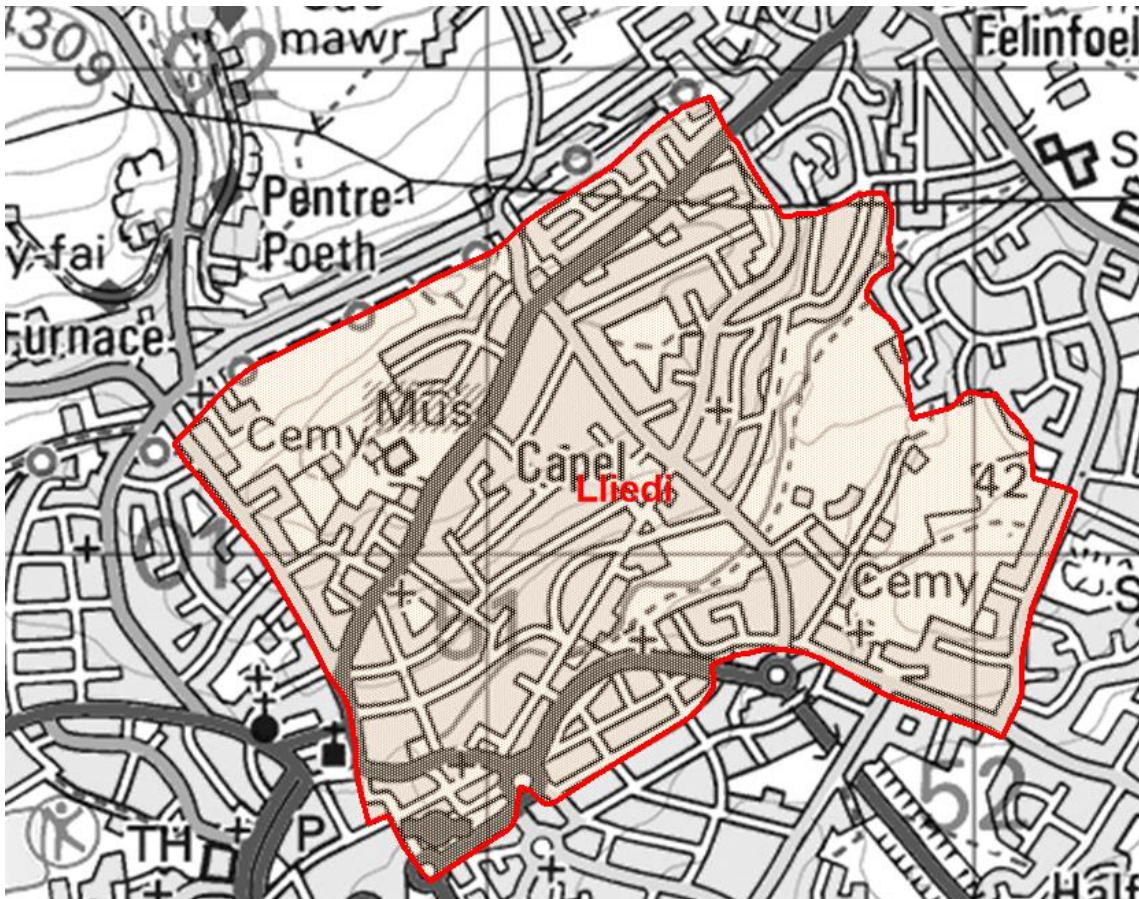

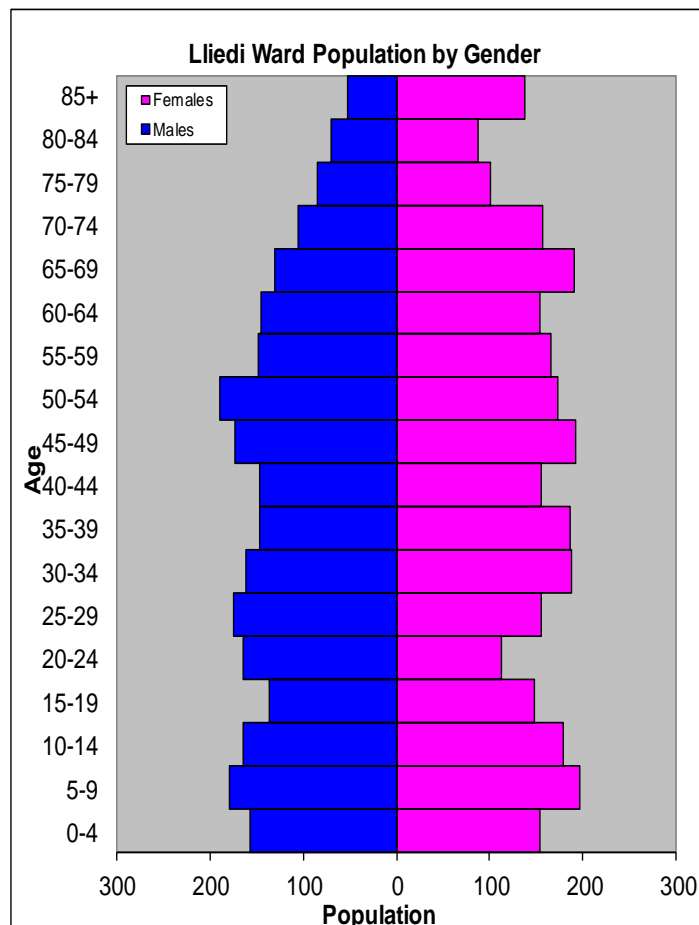

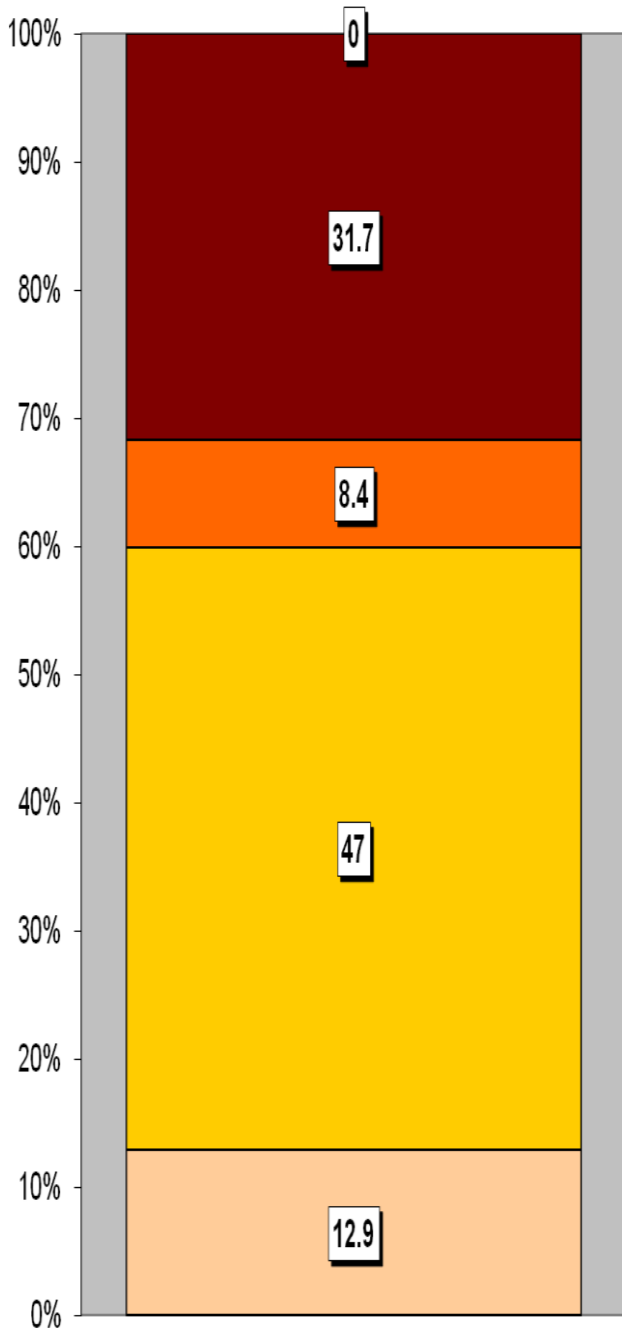

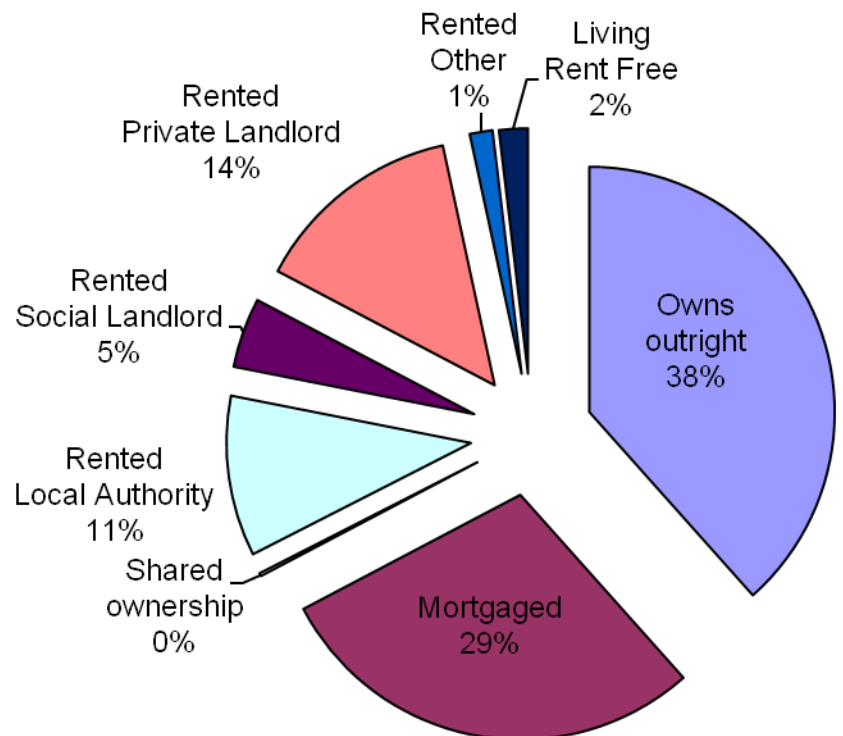
HOUSING

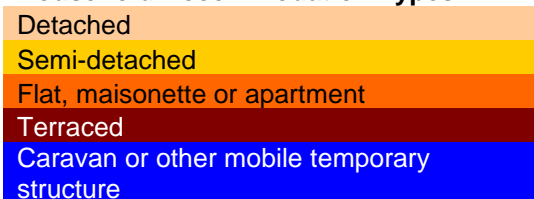

SOCIO-ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

- ⇒ The estimated median household income for Lliedi, based on CACI's 2019 'PayCheck' data, is £25,253 which is the 16th lowest (of 58 wards) in Carmarthenshire and 7.5% below the Carmarthenshire median of £27,148.
- ⇒ The social profile information indicates a higher than average level of people who have never worked and long term unemployed (Level 8) and a higher than average number of people in semi-routine occupations (Level 6).

WELSH INDEX OF MULTIPLE DEPRIVATION (WIMD)

WIMD 2019 based on fine-grained geography of lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs). The WIMD 2019 is compiled from eight domains, Income, Employment, Health, Education, Housing, Access to Services, Physical Environment and Community Safety and is published at Lower Super Output Area of which there are 112 in Carmarthenshire.

Under WIMD, where Rank 1 is the most deprived, **Lliedi 1** ranks 22 in Carmarthenshire from 112 LSOAs and is ranked 499 in Wales from 1909 LSOAs. **Lliedi 2** ranks 97 in Carmarthenshire and is ranked 1309 in Wales, whilst **Lliedi 3** ranks as the 14th most deprived area in Carmarthenshire and is ranked 395 in Wales from 1909 LSOAs.

The highest level of deprivation attributed to **Lliedi 1** is the Community Safety domain, ranking 10th in Carmarthenshire and 239 in Wales. In **Lliedi 2** the Physical Environment domain is the most prominent, being ranked 5th in Carmarthenshire and 200 in Wales for this domain. In **Lliedi 3** the Health domain that is the most prominent, ranking 11th in Carmarthenshire and 355 in Wales.
