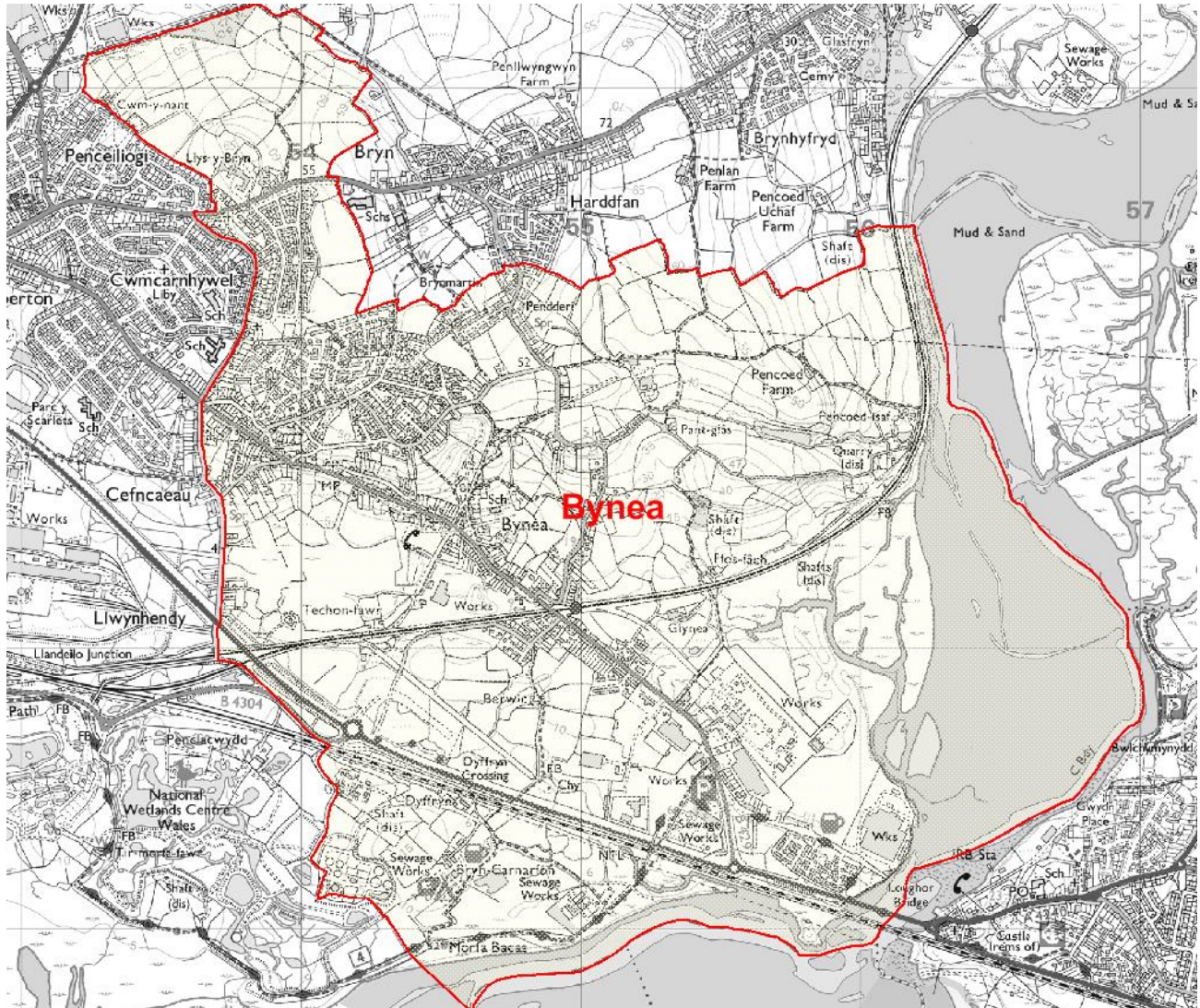

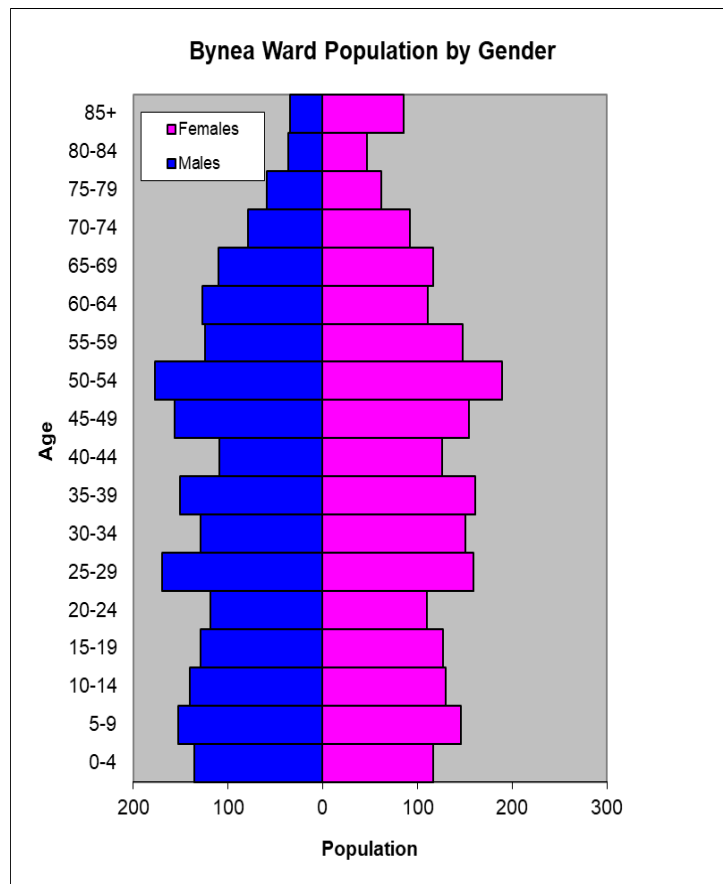

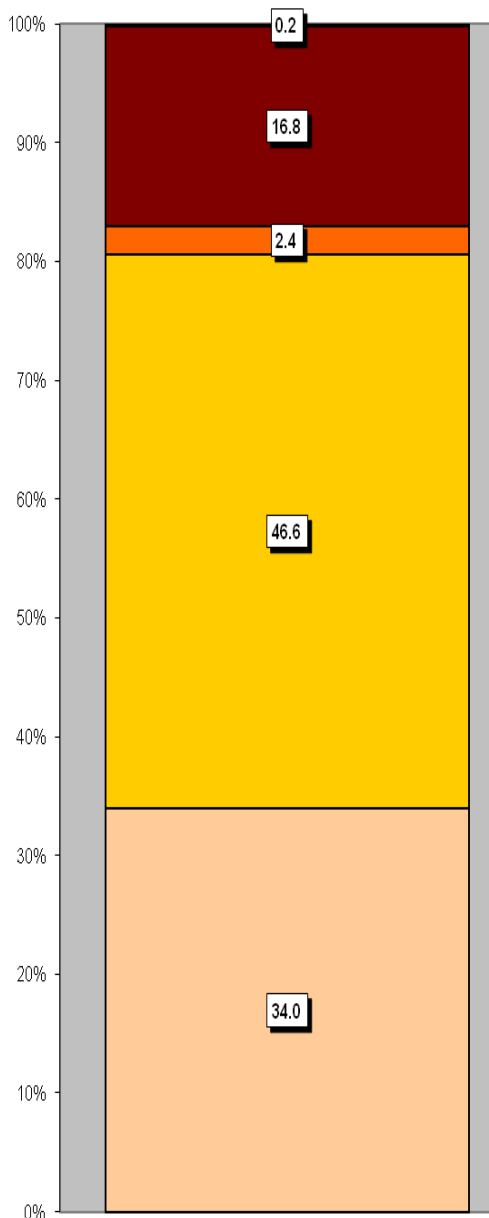

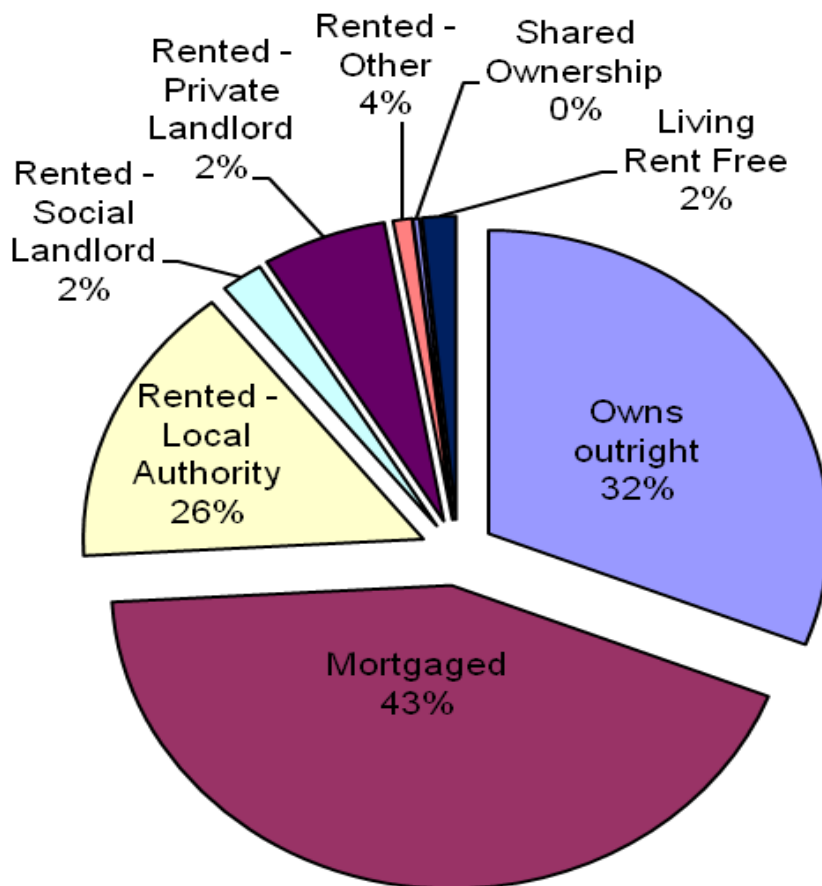
HOUSING

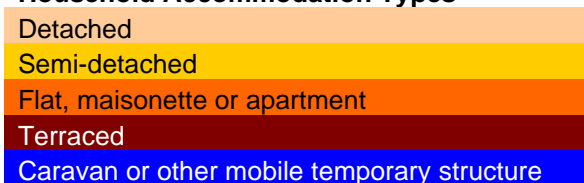

SOCIO-ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

- ⇒ The estimated median household income for Bynea, based on CACI's 2020 'PayCheck' data, is £31,546 which is the 13th highest (of 58 wards) in Carmarthenshire and 10.7% above the Carmarthenshire median of £28,186
- ⇒ The social profile information indicates a higher than average level of people in higher/lower managerial professional administrative and intermediate occupations (Levels 1-2).

WELSH INDEX OF MULTIPLE DEPRIVATION (WIMD)

WIMD 2019 based on fine-grained geography of lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs). The WIMD 2019 is compiled from eight domains, Income, Employment, Health, Education, Housing, Access to Services, Physical Environment and Community Safety and is published at Lower Super Output Area of which there are 112 in Carmarthenshire.

Under WIMD, where Rank 1 is the most deprived, **Bynea 1** ranks 91 out of the 112 LSOAs in Carmarthenshire and ranks 1273 in Wales from 1909 LSOAs, whilst **Bynea 2** ranks 39 out of the 112 LSOAs in Carmarthenshire and ranks 728 in Wales from 1909 LSOAs.

The highest level of deprivation attributed to **Bynea 1** is the Physical Environment, being ranked 15th in Carmarthenshire and 272th in Wales for this domain. In **Bynea 2** it's the Health domain that is the most prominent ranking 18 in Carmarthenshire and 512 in Wales.
