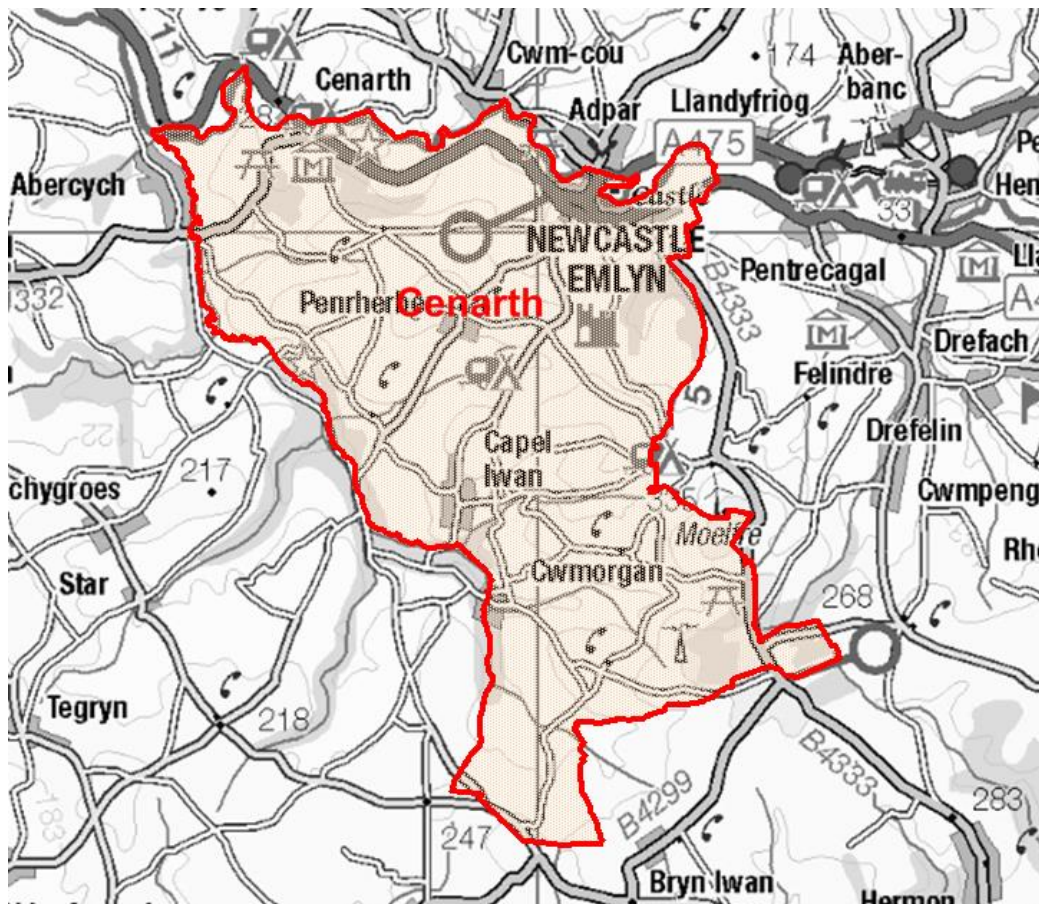

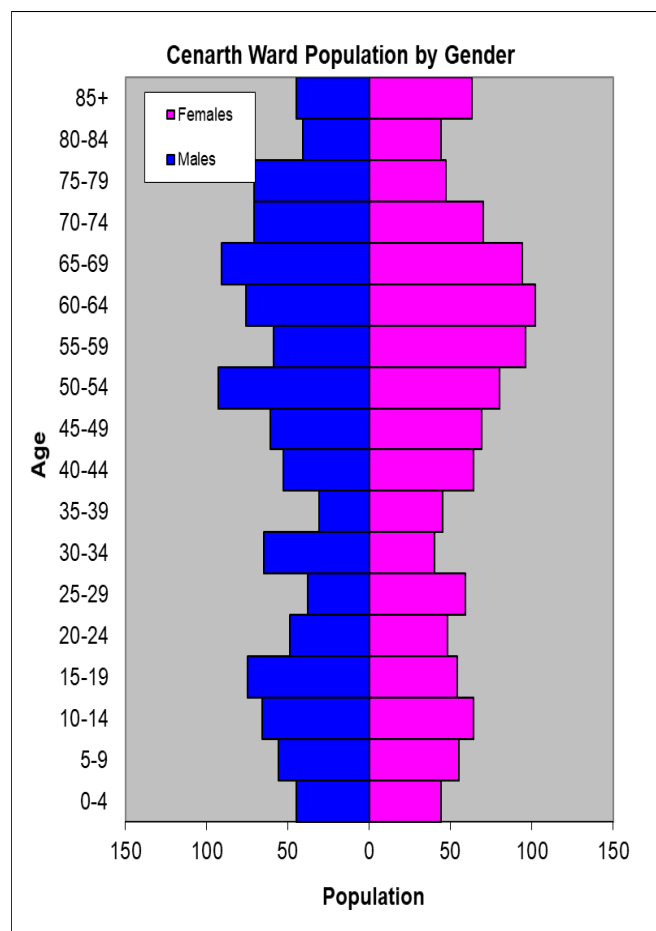

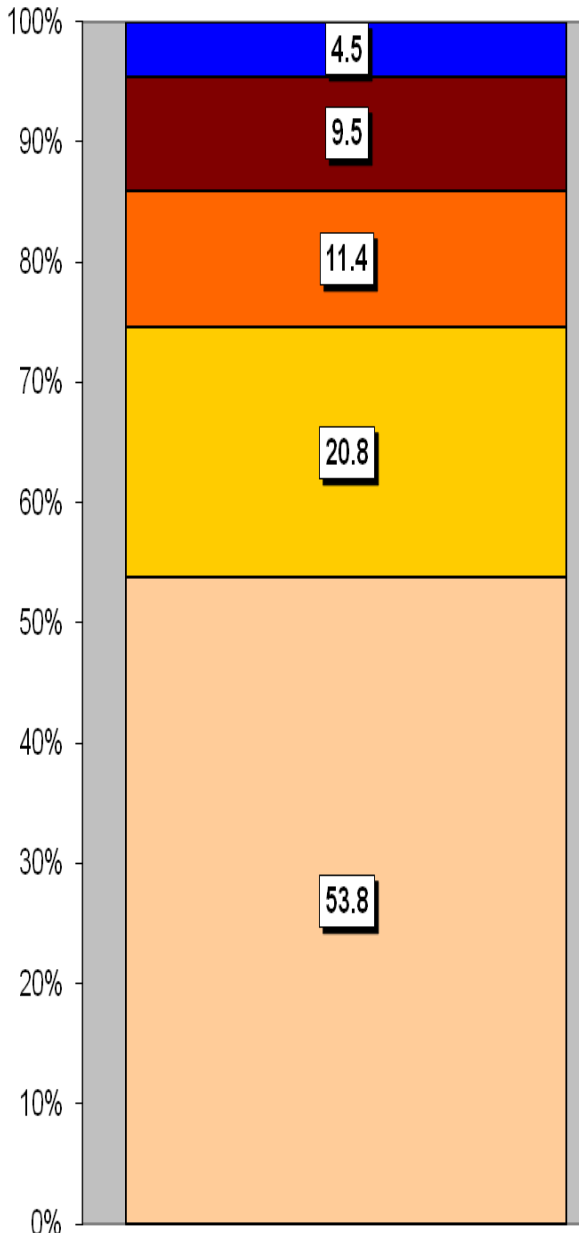

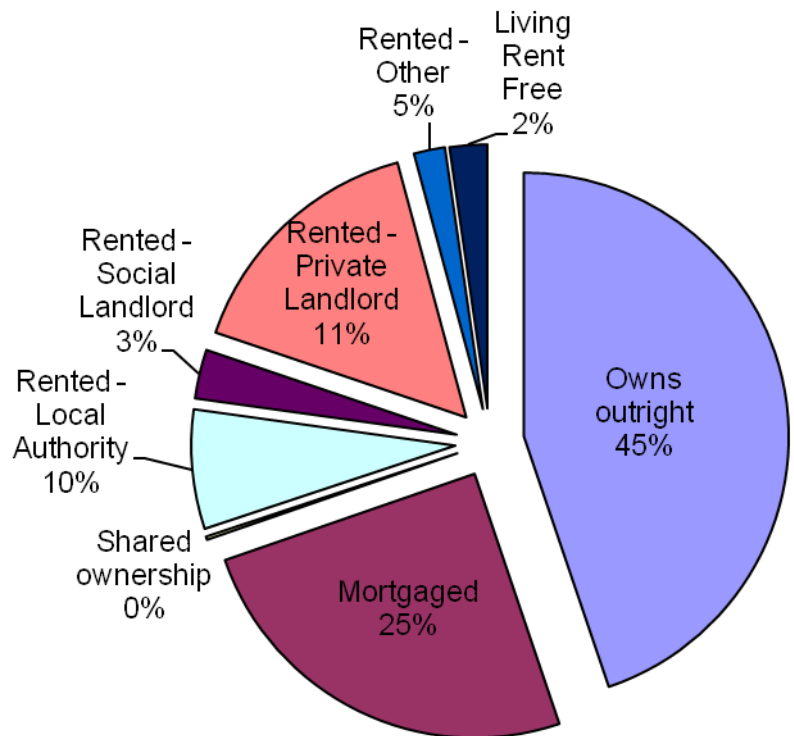
HOUSING

The area's housing consists mainly of detached houses, which has a larger proportion than the other categories combined. Semi-detached hold the next highest proportion, followed by flats, maisonettes or apartments. Caravan or other mobile temporary structure have the lowest proportion. The ward consists of 70 local authority owned properties and 29 Housing Association properties.

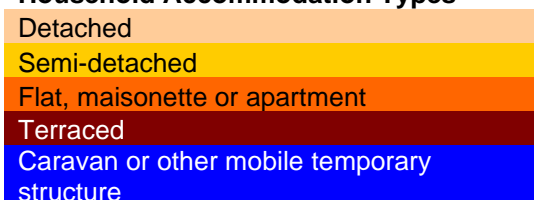

SOCIO-ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

- ⇒ The estimated median household income for Cenarth based on CACI's 2020 'PayCheck' data, is £27,278 which is the 20th lowest (of 58 wards) in Carmarthenshire and 3.3% below the Carmarthenshire median of £28,186.
- ⇒ The social profile information indicates a higher than average level of people classed as small employers and own account workers (Level 4) and a lower than average number of people employed in routine occupations (Level 7).

WELSH INDEX OF MULTIPLE DEPRIVATION (WIMD)

WIMD 2019 based on fine-grained geography of lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs). The WIMD 2019 is compiled from eight domains, Income, Employment, Health, Education, Housing, Access to Services, Physical Environment and Community Safety and is published at Lower Super Output Area of which there are 112 in Carmarthenshire. Under WIMD, where Rank 1 is the most deprived, **Cenarth** ranks 42 out of 112 in Carmarthenshire and is ranked 758 in Wales from 1909 LSOAs.

The highest level of deprivation attributed to **Cenarth** is the Housing domain, being ranked 13th in Carmarthenshire and 185 in Wales for this domain.
