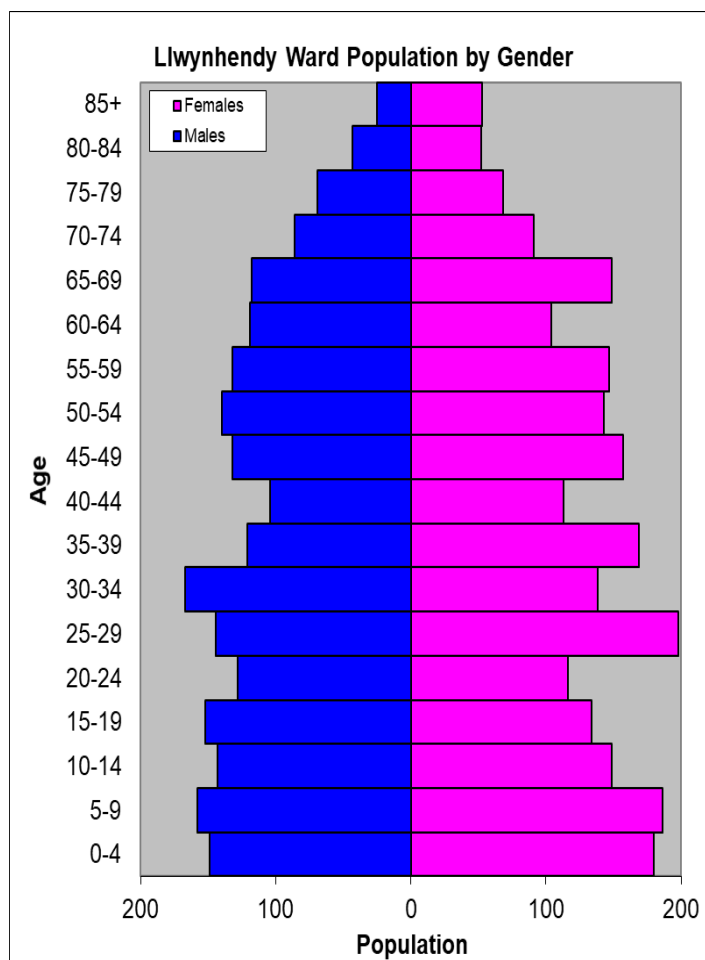

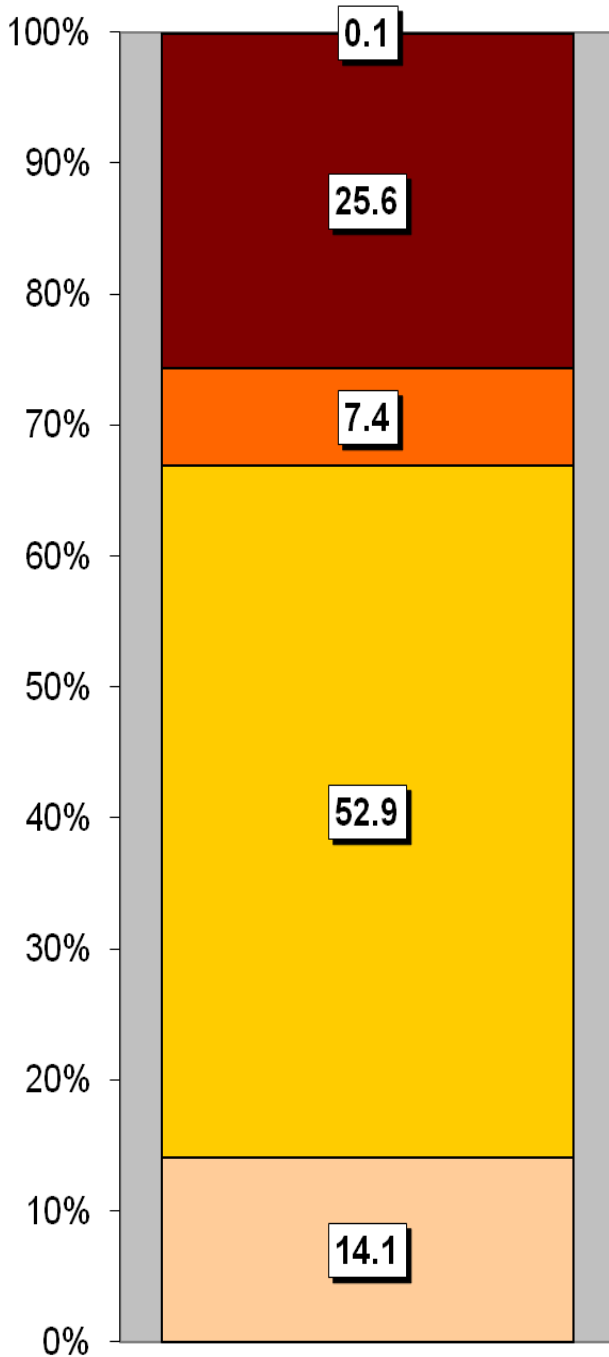

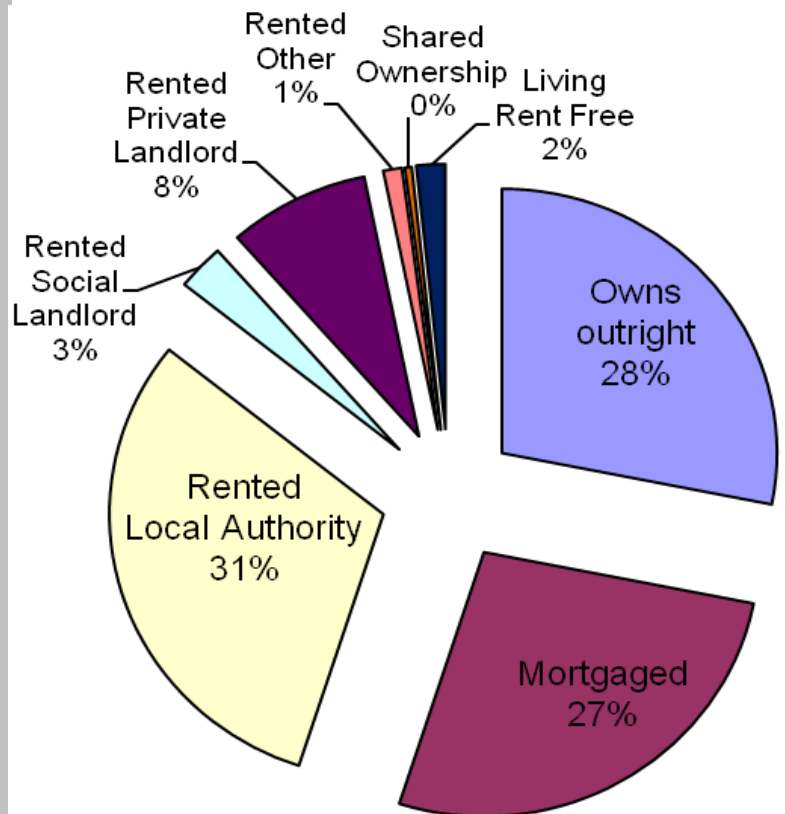
## HOUSING

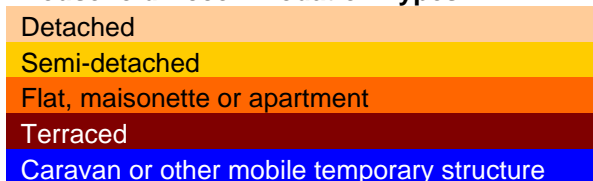

## SOCIO-ECONOMIC CHARACTERISTICS

- ⇒ The estimated median household income for Llwynhendy, based on CACI's 2020 'PayCheck' data, is £22,849 which is the 3<sup>rd</sup> lowest (of 58 wards) in Carmarthenshire and 23.4% below the Carmarthenshire median of £28,186.
- ⇒ The social profile information indicates a higher than average level of people who have never worked and long term unemployed (Level 8) and a higher than average number of people in semi-routine occupations (Level 6).

## WELSH INDEX OF MULTIPLE DEPRIVATION (WIMD)

WIMD 2019 based on fine-grained geography of lower Super Output Areas (LSOAs). The WIMD 2019 is compiled from eight domains, Income, Employment, Health, Education, Housing, Access to Services, Physical Environment and Community Safety and is published at Lower Super Output Area of which there are 112 in Carmarthenshire.

Under WIMD, where Rank 1 is the most deprived, **Llwynhendy 1** ranks 38<sup>th</sup> in Carmarthenshire from 112 LSOAs and is ranked 693 in Wales from 1909 LSOAs.

**Llwynhendy 2** ranks as the 7<sup>th</sup> most deprived area in Carmarthenshire and is ranked 222 from 1909 LSOAs in Wales. **Llwynhendy 3** ranks as the 5<sup>th</sup> most deprived area in Carmarthenshire and is ranked 172 from 1909 LSOAs in Wales.

The highest level of deprivation attributed to **Llwynhendy 1** is the Health domain, being ranked 21<sup>st</sup> in Carmarthenshire and 536 in Wales for this domain. In **Llwynhendy 2** the Health domain is also the most prominent deprivation domain, ranking 4<sup>th</sup> in Carmarthenshire and 170 in Wales. In **Llwynhendy 3** it is also the Health domain which is the most prominent ranking 2<sup>nd</sup> in Carmarthenshire and 80 in Wales.
