

THE COUNTY OF CARMARTHENSHIRE (A485 ROAD, ALLTWALIS)

(IMPOSITION OF A TEMPORARY 10 M.P.H. SPEED LIMIT) ORDER 2026

WHEREAS Carmarthenshire County Council (hereinafter referred to as “the Council”), being the Highway Authority for that length of the A485 Alltwalis road from a point 730 metres south-west of its junction with the U5503 Coedllwydion Road for a distance of approximately 250 metres in a south-westerly direction, is satisfied that:

- a) the construction works being undertaken by the Council on or near the A485 road at Alltwalis are ongoing; and
- b) it is necessary that the temporary speed restriction introduced by the Emergency Notice issued on the Eighth day of January Two Thousand and Twenty-Six and made under Section 14(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 continues in force,

NOW THEREFORE the Council, in exercise of its powers under Section 14(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (as amended), the Road Traffic (Temporary Restrictions) Procedure Regulations 1992 and all other enabling powers, hereby makes the following Order:

1. No person shall cause any vehicle to proceed at a speed exceeding 10 M.P.H. along that section of the Class A Road (A485 Road Alltwalis) from a point 730 metres south-west of its junction with the U5503 Coedllwydion Road for a distance of approximately 250 metres in a south-westerly direction for the duration of this Order.
2. “The County of Carmarthenshire (Imposition of 30 M.P.H. Speed Limit) Order 2023” and “The County of Carmarthenshire (Imposition of 40 M.P.H. Speed

Limit) Order 2024" are hereby temporarily suspended as it relates to the affected length of road and for the duration of this Order only.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the Twenty-eighth Day of January Two Thousand and Twenty-Six and may be cited as "The County of Carmarthenshire (A485 Road, Alltwalis) (Imposition of a Temporary 10 M.P.H. Speed Limit) Order 2026" and shall remain in force for a period not exceeding eighteen months.
4. The Order shall not apply to:
 - a) vehicles being used by the Fire Brigade, Ambulance or Police if observance of the restriction would likely hinder the purpose for which that vehicle is being used on that occasion, provided that the conditions prevailing on site at any one time do not render it unsafe or impossible for such vehicles to be exempt;
 - b) anything done at the direction, or with the permission, of a police constable in uniform or a civil enforcement officer; or
 - c) any reasonable access requirements by local residents or pedestrians.
