- An application for a licence shall be made <u>NOT LATER</u> than the first-day of the month preceding that in which it is proposed to commence the collection.
   Organisations are requested to submit applications, by the 31<sup>st</sup> December, of each year for collections that are to take place the following year.
- 2. Each section of the form must be completed and a copy of the most recent account of any charity which is to benefit **MUST** be attached.
- 3. Applicants are advised to ensure that if granted a licence they are able to comply with the House to House Collection Regulations 1947 and in particular:
  - Obtain the prescribed collectors certificates and badges which must be purchased from HM Stationery Office.
  - b) Issue collectors with <u>SEALED</u> collecting boxes, numbered, and clearly indicating the purpose of the collection.
  - c) Provide an account of the collection within one month of the expiry of the permit.
