Carmarthenshire County Council Economic Development Team will be on hand to provide information about their ongoing commitment to economic development and supporting businesses Carmarthenshire County council, with the provision of the following grants funded by the UK Governments Shared Prosperity Fund.

Both grants aim to strengthen local entrepreneurial ecosystems and support businesses at all stages of their development to start, sustain, grow, and innovate, including through local networks.

Start-up Grant

The Start Up Fund is to support the creation of new businesses in the county, resulting directly in the creation of jobs, therefore improving the local economy.

The Fund will be a business grant scheme, which will include support towards capital expenditure projects and specialist revenue expenditure (not including ongoing running costs), where new jobs are a created and/or safeguarded because of the financial support.

Growth Grants

The grant will support local businesses and Inward investors to grow, prosper and be sustainable. Resulting in the creation or safeguarding of jobs throughout the County, therefore improving the local economy. Whilst priority will be given to the creation of new jobs, it is acknowledged that the safeguarding of jobs under the current economic climate is also extremely important and will be considered accordingly on a case-by-case basis.

Community Benefits / Social Value expert representatives from the regional Local Authorities will be on hand to discuss the community benefit and social value requirements of the new framework and outline the support available to the sector in achieving and monitoring meaningful targets.

Cyfle Building Skills Shared Apprentice Scheme provides a service which supports young adults into sustainable employment within the construction industry. This will help young people further their careers and their chances of gaining employment. They will have the opportunity to gain apprenticeships and achieve qualifications at level 2, 3 & into higher apprenticeships at level 4/5.

Cyfle Building Skills Employs Shared Apprentices in the following trades:

Bricklaying, Plastering, Carpentry, Electrical, Plumbing, Painting & Decorating, Maintenance/Multi-Skilling, Technical.

The Shared Apprenticeship Scheme allows apprentices to complete a full apprenticeship program by working with a number of different employers, to gain the skill sets they require to become qualified.

Shared Apprentice Scheme - Cyfle Building

Onsite Hub for the Construction Industry Cyfle Building Skills, on behalf of the Region, launched an innovative new programme in 2021 that offers 1,600 fully funded onsite work placements within the construction industry over the next four years.

Funded by the Construction Industry Training Board's (CITB) Onsite Experience Commission, the programme is designed to help tackle the skills gap within the construction industry and will allow Cyfle to develop the first construction Training Hub in South West Wales across the five Local Authority areas within the Region.

The programme offers Construction Opportunities to 1,600 individuals including Onsite experience placements and associated training, and reskilling opportunities. A mentoring programme has also been designed to help individuals take the next step into a career in construction, ensuring they benefit from the Onsite Experience, which will also support the programme.

The programme is open to individuals of any age who are considering a career in construction either as a first job or by retraining from a different profession. It will look to promote social mobility and provide opportunities to those under-represented within the industry, as well as those not currently in education, employment or training (NEET).

Onsite Hub - Cyfle Building

Carmarthenshire Construction Training Association Limited (CCTAL) is a training association established in Carmarthenshire in association with a diverse and dynamic range of construction companies and local training providers.

The voluntary partnership aims to offer a mutual support infrastructure to member organisations and provides a support structure for the training and development needs of its association members, as well as opportunities, training and advice for apprentices and trainees within the construction industry across the Carmarthenshire region.

CCTAL works closely with local colleges and training providers to identify training needs within the industry, and where possible, endorse the achievement of recognised qualifications to training for future generations.

Swansea Bay City Deal is an investment of up to £1.3 billion in a portfolio of major projects and programmes across the Swansea Bay City Region, which is being funded by the UK Government, Welsh Government, public sector and the private sector. Over the 15-year lifespan of the portfolio, the City Deal will boost the regional economy by at least £1.8 billion, while generating over 9,000 jobs.

The Swansea Bay City Deal is being led by the four regional local authorities - Carmarthenshire Council, Swansea Council, Neath Port Talbot Council and Pembrokeshire Council - together with the Swansea Bay University and Hywel Dda University Health Boards, Swansea University, the University of Wales Trinity Saint David, and private sector partners.

University of Wales Trinity Saint David's Construction Wales Innovation Centre (CWIC) has been funded to offer a new training programme which we've called Construct Net Zero Cymru (CNZC). CNZC is made of two distinctive projects that will focus on broadening our understanding of the green agenda as well as develop practical training skills.

Not Business As Usual is a practical approach to promoting a greater awareness of the principles and techniques used in the design, construction, and maintenance of a variety of low–carbon construction methods, with a particular focus on the building fabric. Training will be offered to participants from Swansea, Neath Port Talbot, Carmarthenshire and Pembrokeshire.

Efficiency Without Compromise is a Passivhaus training project that will create a greater awareness of the principles and techniques used in the design, construction, and maintenance of a variety of existing schemes in Carmarthenshire.
